#### From the Desk of Pastor Mark:

"Whenever I'm afraid, I put my trust in you." (Psalm 56:3) This was the theme verse for Vacation Bible School (VBS) this year, and it was a good one. VBS met five nights in a row from 6-8 pm. Each night focused on a different aspect of trusting God.

- 1. Trust that God Goes with Us.
- 2. Trust God to Lead the Way.
- 3. Trust God to Share Wisdom.
- 4. Trust God to Give us Peace.
- 5. Trust God to Spark Joy.

Each of these daily themes was reinforced throughout the evening. It began with the opening each night, where they sang songs and had illustrations reinforcing the themes. Science, snack/story time, games, and crafts were the different stations that kids rotated to for fun and creative ways to reinforce

the theme. Then everyone gathered again for closing songs and a quiz focused on the days theme bible story. It was a great week! Several of the kids sang on Sunday morning for worship. When I quizzed them on the daily themes and bible verses during the Children's Message, they aced it.

Over 80 kids had a wonderful week learning to trust God. There was something else really cool about this week as well. Over 60 volunteers helped in some way to ensure that this week was a success. Many people started the decorations, planning games, organizing crafts and science projects, practicing songs, shopping for snacks, advertising at the parade, organizing volunteers, and taking care of all the little details weeks before VBS even started. When VBS arrived, there was a plethora of volunteers ready to ensure the kids had a memorable week. The re-

#### August is Back-to-School Scholarships Month for Myamba Lutheran Parish

During August—back-to-school month in Iowa—St. Peter also focuses on our companion congregation in Tanzania, Myamba Lutheran Parish. We emphasize the secondary school scholarship program for certain Myamba students attending four years of public secondary school—those whose families need financial support in order to afford to send their children to school.

A \$100 annual scholarship provides school fees, school uniform, socks and shoes; hot lunch, testing fees, and school security. Sponsors can also give \$15 to cover the cost of a Swahili Bible for a first-year scholarship student and a notebook and pen given to each scholarship recipient. Scholarship sponsors are partners with students' parents in providing for their education.

95 students are receiving annual scholarships for the 2024 calendar year school year through St. Peter's program. Let's match that "95" number for the 2025 school year beginning January 2025!!

Hear all about it! You'll learn more about this program and how you can help during brief Myamba Moments at the beginning of each worship service in August. We'll show pictures of the schools and the students and provide updates on school for the deaf and secondary school students. In a "where are they now" segment, two of the first twelve students who received scholarships from 2011 to 2014 will be featured. Pledge cards are provided. Pledge payments can be placed in the offering plates, in the baskets on the information table, received online, or mailed to the office.

#### St. Peter's Additional Supports of Myamba Lutheran Parish

While St. Peter's Secondary School Scholarship Program has the most widespread impact on students and families of Myamba Lutheran Parish, St. Peter conducts additional programs to benefit Myamba, such as:

- Scholarships for hearing-impaired Myamba students to attend Mwanga School for the Deaf, a ministry of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in Tanzania. Four young girls of Myamba Parish attend Mwanga. St. Peter Sunday school offerings pay a portion of the costs.
- Medical support for young children of Myamba Parish who have bowed legs which can either be corrected surgically or, in less severe cases, with leg braces. Since 2011, three Myamba children have had surgery and three have received braces. Sioux City orthopedic surgeon, Dr. Steve Meyer, through the non-profit he co-founded—Siouxland Tanzania Educational Medical Ministries—has either performed or overseen these treatments. St. Peter's Myamba Ministry Team coordinates appointments and sends an allowance for travel and x-ray expenses for a child and the parents to travel to a regional hospital for treatment.
- Contributing toward Myamba confirmation class costs for curriculum and Bibles. St. Peter confirmation class
  offerings, "Together we can CHANGE the world" collected in September and October will be sent to Myamba,
  where a recent confirmation class had 104 students.
- Providing education expense support for post-secondary students seeking higher education or vocational training. Requests are handled on a case-by-case basis as fund surpluses allow
- An annual gift of \$2,500 from St. Peter to Myamba, provided by offerings through a General Fund line item. Gifts are used for building projects or parish-wide expenses.
- Occasional financial gifts to nearby Gonja Lutheran Hospital, owned by the Pare Diocese, of which Myamba Parish is a member. St. Peter sponsored a pallet of medical supplies, shipped to Tanzania in December 2023, which arrived at Gonja in March, 2024.

**\$100 provides an annual scholarship** for a student of Myamba Lutheran Parish, St. Peter's Tanzanian companion. \$100 covers approximately half of the costs to attend school for the year: tuition, school supplies; school uniforms (shirt/slacks/sweaters for boys; blouse/skirt/sweater for girls), shoes, socks, hot lunch, etc.

An additional \$15 will provide a Swahili Bible for a first-year scholarship student, as well as a school notebook and pen, thus giving tangible items while also addressing the student's spiritual needs.

In this way, St. Peter's scholarship program partners with students' parents/guardians to help pay for the education of those students most in need of financial assistance, as identified by Myamba's companionship committee, Pastor, Parish Evangelists, and lay leadership.
