From the Desk of Pastor Mark:

The road construction around the church is moving along quickly. Our road access to James street is now closed, although the road remains open to traffic. Our new entrance, which opens onto 11th street south of the church, is now open. We're not sure how long this will last, but we will only be able to use the 11th street access for a while.

What does this mean in the short term?

It's an inconvenience. Change is always hard. It will take some extra thinking/planning to get to church for a while. In the beginning we will only be able to enter the church parking lot from 11th street coming from the east. We will also only be able to exit the parking lot onto 11th street heading east. This will be

until the roundabout is completed on James Street. My mind is usually on autopilot when I head to church. If you're like me, it will take some conscious thinking to make it to church without unnecessary Uturns and rerouting. In the grand scheme of things, this is a small inconvenience. Especially when I think about what many of our brothers and sisters in Christ around the world, such as our friends in Tanzania, go through to get to church. This is my encouragement to make a plan and commitment to continue participating in St. Peter ministries during the inconvenience.

2. Things will look and feel different. Entering the church from the south will look different. It won't be the familiar view turning into the church parking lot and viewing the front of the church. Entering from

It will most likely feel strange driving into the church parking lot from a new direction. The familiar comfort of pulling into the church parking lot won't be there. It will be uncomfortable. It will be a temporary discomfort though, until you get used to it. This is my encouragement to be prepared for things to look and feel a little different when you first arrive at church.

What does this mean long term?

- Eventually St. Peter will have two entrance/exits to the church. Greater accessibility will turn the short-term inconvenience into a long-term convenience.
- Easier access for people coming from the southeast, particularly those that live right across the train tracks. The train tracks with tree line put a physical and visual barrier between the church and housing on the other side. Connecting 11th street to James street will greatly open up that area of the community to the church.
- 3. St. Peter will no longer be safely tucked back by the trees away from street traffic. St. Peter will no longer have a peaceful view to the south and west looking across farm fields. St. Peter will soon become a church on the corner. Street traffic will be passing on the south and west sides of the church.

Truth be told, it's been an uncomfortable adjustment for me with all of the construction. When the trees were cleared on the railroad tracks for 11th street it was an initial shock to my system. I couldn't believe how different it looked and felt. I've enjoyed the peacefulness St. Peter has enjoyed cozily tucked back by the trees. I've enjoyed being able to look south and west to watch the farm fields change through the seasons. These comforts and joys are changing. Change is hard.

If the church was meant to be a place solely for the benefits of its members, then all of these changes would be tragic. This is the most important thing to remember during all this change. The church is meant to be a place to experience the hope, peace, love, and joy of Christ. The church is also meant to be a blessing for the whole community and world in which it exists. We know this at St. Peter. "Gathered to Grow. Sent to Serve." That's who we are. We know the gifts and blessings of God are not meant to be kept to ourselves. We know that the love of God is for all people. Our location and context might be changing a bit. That doesn't change who we are though. We are still God's beloved children. We are still freed and forgiven through Christ Jesus. And...we are still called and sent to share this love of God in Christ Jesus with the world. I believe these contextual changes taking place, while inconvenient and uncomfortable, will ultimately open more opportunities to share the Good News of God's love with the world. I invite you to join me in acknowledging the discomfort. I invite you to join me in grieving the losses that come with change. I invite you to join me in looking for the opportunities God is opening up for us to share the love of Christ with the world.


Youth Trips July 2024


A Moment for Myamba Missions – Gonja Hospital

One focus of St. Peter's Myamba Ministry is Gonja Lutheran Hospital, located in Tanzania's Pare Mountains. Gonja plays a vital role in meeting the health needs of the people of Myamba and nearby villages—a population of over 125,000 people. Gonja has an 87-bed capacity, a staff of 63 and oversees 5 area dispensaries. It offers typical services plus reproductive child health, palliative care, hypertension and diabetes clinics, and an HIV/AIDS treatment center.

St. Peter's first mission trip to Myamba Parish, in 2009, included a Gonja service project, as have subsequent mission trips. The first project involved repairing, washing, and painting the plaster walls of two operating rooms (see photo, top right). The hospital matron, Dora Mtango, RN visited St. Peter in 2014!

Pregnant women come to Gonja to give birth because well-birth outcomes are much better there. Finances at Gonja are stretched for many reasons. For example, the government bars hospitals like Gonja from collecting payments or donations for live-birth services but requires Gonja to serve all pregnant women who come. There is no food service so patients' families prepare their meals and do their laundry.

St. Peter donations for Gonja have provided medicines, supplies, and equipment including a microscope. During the pandemic, donations bought masks, gloves, soaps, and sanitizers. Perry Lutheran Home and Luther Park, Des Moines, donated used mechanical hospital beds which St. Peter helped to ship in December 2023 (photos below). Support for Gonja Hospital and other Myamba Parish health needs are always welcome! You may designate giving over and above your regular St. Peter giving to "Myamba Missions."


