# From the Desk of Pastor Mark:

Christmas is one of the most festive and celebratory seasons in the church year. Being at the end of December, it makes for a fantastic finish to the calendar year. We can ring in the new year filled with the hope, peace, joy, and love of Christ with the Christmas music and carols still ringing in our ears. The season of Christmas is the shortest season in the church calendar though, being only 12 days long. In the midst of this world, the Son of God, Jesus Christ, appears and offers new life, the life of the Spirit of God." These gifts of Christ are with us each and every day. Unfortunately, because we are "occupied and preoccupied with many things," we don't recognize and enjoy their benefits.

# Blanket Sunday is February 23rd

**February 23 is St. Peter's Annual Fleece Blanket Sunday.** We will once again be making fleece blankets for the patients of MercyOne Hospitals in Des Moines. New this year we will be donating a portion of our blankets to the IHYC (Iowa Homeless Youth Center in Des Moines). We've had great success with this project in past years and are looking forward to seeing how many blankets we can make again this year!

This is a great time of year to find fleece on sale at local fabric stores. Please purchase either Blizzard or Anti-Pill fleece as other types of fleece are not suitable for making tie blankets.

What is the Fleece Blanket Project? These donated blankets to Mercy One Hospitals are given to patients from newborns to people at the end of their lives. They serve as comfort and are enjoyed by all ages.

# How Can I Help?

- Donate fabric 2 pieces of fleece (each 1 1/2 yards in size) makes one blanket or 2 pieces of fleece (each 2 yards in size for the youth served by IHYC.)
- Donate a completed blanket! Create a blanket with your family, friends, Bible Study, small group, sports team, neighborhood group etc.
- 3. Sponsor a blanket by donating \$20.00.
- 4. Help prepare the Fellowship Hall for the blanket tying event. (This will be done on Saturday, Feb. 22)
- 5. Help on Sunday, February 23rd during the tying event. Never made a blanket before? That's ok – if you can tie your shoe you can tie a blanket.

#### Faith Formation Report—Jill Capps

- Faith Formation: Our Annual MLK Week of service will run from January 15th-22nd. Members of the congregation will come together to make breakfast casseroles for the Salvation Army's mobile breakfast canteen. We are offering a few evening time slots for those who are unable to attend on either Sunday or Monday. If you have not participated in this event before I encourage you to give it a try – we have had families with children as young as 3 participate along with individuals, teens, adults of all ages etc., ALL are welcome!
- Preparations have begun for our Annual Fleece Blanket Project in February which will be held on February 23rd. You can participate by donating \$20 to sponsor a blanket, helping to set-up and prep blankets on Saturday, Feb 22nd and tying blankets on Sunday, February 23rd during the Sunday school hour.
