From the Desk of Pastor Mark:

Gathered to Grow. Sent to Serve. We hear this and say this often at St. Peter Lutheran Church. It helps to shape who we want to be as God's people. It is also shorthand for living our baptismal promises. At baptism, promises are made by us or on our behalf:

- To live among God's faithful people.
- To hear the word of God and share in the Lord's Supper.
- To proclaim the good news of God in Christ through word and deed.
- To serve all people, following the example of Jesus.
- To strive for justice and peace in all the earth.

One way that we live out our calling to love is through advocacy, which I was reminded of this week. On Tuesday, March 11th, I went to Lutheran Day on the Hill. It is a day that is organized and supported by Lutheran Services in Iowa (LSI) and the three ELCA synods in Iowa. The morning began at Capitol Hill Lutheran Church downtown. We opened with a time of prayer and worship. The three different bishops encouraged us to live our baptism and reminded us of the promises made at baptism. We then heard from the director of LSI, who shared much of the important work being done through their ministries. (On the next page of this VOICE newsletter you will find information on LSI ministries.) We then heard from an Iowa Senator, who happens to be an ordained ELCA pastor, encouraging us to be advocates on behalf of the poor and most vulnerable. The last speaker was a lobbyist sharing some "best practices" for speaking with legislatures. We then ate lunch and went to the capitol building.

Over the stairs in the capital rotunda are written in bold gold lettering, "Courageous confidence in the intelligence of the community is the sure sign of leadership and success. The ideal state that in which an injury done to the least of its citizens is an injury done to all." One way to live our baptism "serving all people...striving for justice and peace" is through advocating for just policies that do not cause "injury" to anyone, particularly the most vulnerable in our midst. Leaders need to hear from the community (meaning us) whether policies being made are just and fair for all people. One of my professors in seminary often said, "The question is not whether this is good for me, but whether this is good for my neighbor." Advocating for just and fair policies for all people is important.

I'll admit, advocacy is not a strength of mine. It's out of my comfort zone. It's not something that I have a lot of experience with. I'm learning, though. I too do my best to "Grow." As I grow in knowledge and God's love, I pray that the Spirit continues to empower me and lead me in ways that "Serve" the people and world that God so loves. I've recognized that one way I can "Grow" in "Serving" is through advocacy. If advocacy is something you already do, thank you and keep up the good work. #### Holy Week & Easter Schedule

April 13—Palm Sunday begins Holy Week, remembering Jesus' celebrated return into Jerusalem while crowds gathered and shouted "Hosana!" Palm Sunday worship is at 8:00 and 10:30 a.m.

**April 17—Maundy Thursday** is the name given to the day on which Jesus celebrated the Passover with His disciples, known as the Last Supper, also called Communion. #### HIGHLIGHTS FROM THE CHURCH COUNCIL MEETING FEBRUARY 13, 2025

#### Pastor's Report:

- The Semiannual meeting, youth spaghetti dinner fundraiser, and tie blanket Sunday all made for ministry packed Sundays in February. All of these ministries went very well.
- The Church season of Lent began last week with Ash Wednesday. The weather was sketchy all day, but thankfully we didn't cancel, as it later improved. The soup suppers and worship were both well attended.
- We have typically been pausing Wednesday worship following Easter, which we will be doing again this year. April 9th will be the last Wednesday worship until the Fall.
- I went to Lutheran Day on the Hill, which was on March 11th.
- Emily Wells has turned in her resignation as choir director at St. Peter. She will finish the choir season through May 31st. Emily and her family are not leaving the church. She is stepping back from this role to spend more time with her family. We give thanks to God for Emily sharing her gifts to faithfully lead the choir the past 7 years. Her skill, patience, flexibility and strong faith has been a blessing to the ministry of St. Peter.
- MoM: Discussed options for the Choir Director position following Emily's resignation for the end of the choir season in May. We have roles and responsibilities for the choir director position that may require some review and updates.

- General Fund--February 2025 mtd, expenses were less than monthly income, thus it finished with a surplus of \$4,958.63.
- General Fund--February 2025 ytd, expenses were greater than income, thus it finished with a loss of (\$1,225.07).

Blanket Project in February bringing our 12-year total to 2,217 blankets. Thank you to everyone who participated in this project by donating fleece, money, tying blankets, etc. A special thank you to WELCA for their \$150 donation to help purchase fleece.

- The Easter Egg Hunt Event hosted by Faith Formation, Education, & Evangelism will be on Saturday, April 19th. With the new parking lot, we have less green space than in years past so we will not be increasing the number of registrations this year. We will evaluate the event and determine if we are able to expand it in the future.
- **Confirmation**: We are focusing on the Lent & the Crucifixion & Resurrection during Lent. Confirmation small groups will eat together at the Lenten soup supper & complete a lesson in their classroom.
- VBS: VBS registration began in March, and there are already several volunteers signed up, and several volunteer opportunities still available. Please consider helping during this fun, engaging week where our youngest members build on their Faith.
- **Technology:** We have a couple of members who have asked about assistive hearing devices that can be used during our worship services. I have reached out to a church that uses those devices to get some insight and am looking into vendors and considerations.
- Our contract with Mediacom ends in October. We are looking into new internet options with higher speeds that were not available in 2020. The phones do need to be replaced and could be done by either an outside company or the internet company we choose.
- Website/Facebook: I continue to update our Website/ Facebook daily/weekly. Please remember to share any upcoming events etc. that you would like me to post for you.
- **MoM**: Discussed the options for assistive hearing devices. Contacts made with peers at St. John's Lutheran church in WDM. Considerations of updates to sound board also discussed. Researching options to better assess cost and use.
- Internet Service Provider (ISP) also in review to be able

#### to increase the speed for devices and equipment in use at the church. Quotes from Mediacom and Metronet. Metronet will 'buyout' the Mediacom service if we decide before October renewal. Project to transition in summer.

- Phone technology may require a separate service and if remains analog or is updated to digital technology. Discussed the number of 'phones' that would be required as primary to the Church Office and for Pastor Mark. Metronet is \$20/month for each phone.
- Input from Building and Grounds to update the Fire Alarm system from analog to digital. The panel is an analog and benefit to transition it to digital at the same time.

Exec to take up item on review of ISP option and phone connections as part of April planning.
